

## Lists of Acceptable/Non-Acceptable Materials in Curbside Recycling

- ✓ Acceptable Curbside Recycling Materials Only.
- ✓ Acceptable materials should be dry (especially paper) and covered in bins. These materials should not be exposed to the weather.
- ✓ All materials should be loose in bins. No materials should be in bags.
- ✓ Absolutely no Prohibitive Materials allowed in your curbside bins. (See below)
- ✓ Certain materials may be recyclable, but cannot be placed in your curbside bin. When in doubt, check with your local recycler.

<p><b>Paper Acceptable</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• All full-sheet office paper, white paper</li> <li>• Colored paper</li> <li>• Newspaper (plastic bags and strings removed)</li> <li>• Magazines (all types), catalogs (all types)</li> <li>• Phonebooks (all types)</li> <li>• Junk mail</li> <li>• Paperboard</li> <li>• Tissue boxes</li> <li>• Heavy weight folders</li> <li>• Paper towel and toilet paper rolls</li> </ul>	<p><b>Paper Non Acceptable (Some Examples)</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Shredded Paper (Single-Stream)</li> <li>• Napkins</li> <li>• Tissue paper</li> <li>• Wall paper</li> <li>• Paper towels</li> <li>• Wax paper</li> <li>• Wrapping paper</li> <li>• Any paper which has the potential to be contaminated with bodily fluid</li> </ul>
<p><b>Cardboard Acceptable</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Corrugated cardboard</li> <li>• Brown paper bags</li> <li>• Boxboard (i.e. shoeboxes, gift boxes, cereal boxes)</li> </ul>	<p><b>Cardboard Non Acceptable (Some Examples)</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Cardboard lined with plastic (i.e. bubble wrap boxes)</li> <li>• Waxed/waterproof cardboard</li> <li>• Food soiled boxes (i.e. pizza boxes)</li> </ul>
<p><b>Plastics Acceptable</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Only bottles, jugs and jars (materials must be rinsed) i.e. soda bottles, laundry detergent jugs, water bottles, milk jugs etc....</li> </ul>	<p><b>Plastics Non-Acceptable (Some Examples)</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Plastic “baggies”</li> <li>• Plastic tableware</li> <li>• Styrofoam containers</li> <li>• Shopping, Grocery, Retail bags</li> <li>• Clam-Shells (take-out containers)</li> </ul>
<p><b>Metals Acceptable</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Aluminum and tin beverage containers (materials must be rinsed)</li> <li>• Metal and tin food containers (materials must be rinsed)</li> </ul>	<p><b>Metals Non Acceptable (Some Examples)</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Metal and cardboard containers</li> <li>• Paint cans</li> <li>• Aerosol cans</li> </ul>
<p><b>Glass Acceptable</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Bottles and Jars only (rinsed)</li> </ul>	<p><b>Glass Non Acceptable (Some Examples)</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Everything else</li> </ul>
